District Governor Don Mullen

What is the significance of the number 1600? Other than the street number of the White House, is there really any significance of 1600 at all. At this point I'm pretty sure you are wondering what the heck is the Governor asking us and why is he asking us this?

I actually have an answer, but you're going to have to wait. Before I get to 1600, we need to remind the Club Presidents and Secretaries that attention needs to be given to the election of 2020/2021 Club Officers. I know, it's just January, but Constitutionally Nominating Committees need to form in February, with a slate of Officers being developed; then in March the slate finalized and read to the Club membership; then in April, elections held and 2020/2021 Officers reported to and listed with LCI. We know that several clubs have historically had their own ways of doing this. I understand why, and I'm certainly not trying to tell you what to do. We are just saying there are valid reasons why this timetable has been adopted. It takes time to develop our District Directories as we want the information of anyone listed to be current and accurate. It also takes LCI time to set up systems that allows them to communicate properly. If you should run into difficulties with identifying individuals to step into leadership roles, proceed with elections and report who you have. Hopefully, it will at least be the President and Secretary. As you search to fill vacancies after your election, when you fill a role, please immediately report it. Your cooperation is of much help and greatly appreciated. This will be of great help to the incoming District Governor as he begins to develop his Directory.

Important point: Should you have any trouble using MyLion to report you new Officers, please contact District Secretary Andrea Feeney for help. Frankly, anytime you experience difficulties with MyLion you should contact her. Andrea would be happy to help, even to the point of taking

your info and reporting it. Thank you in advance for your important cooperation in this matter. We will follow up to see how we are progressing in completing this task.

Now, to the number 1600. Did you know that in 1600, Giordano Bruno was executed for apparently being an occultist as he had published the "Expulsion of the Triumphant Beast"? Did you know that 1600 was the highest score a student could achieve on the SAT? Did you know that in October of 1600 the Battle of Sekigahara took place in Japan between to armies of 60,000 men each? Did you know the Angel Number 1600 should remind one of kindness, doing things the right way, staying focused on the right goals, having a positive home filled with inspirational and creative thoughts, and to find strength to stay on task to take things on when they come to you?

So, speaking of a task that is coming to you, did you know that 1600 is also the number of net people we are challenging the District to have by the end of June? We currently sit at a net 1539 people, or a minus 9 compared to this time last year. We ended December at a plus 8. Knowing we would lose some people to begin the year with, we are encouraged that it was lower than expected. With some of the conversations had with various clubs, we are encouraged there is absolutely no reason this number cannot be achieved. Actually, I suppose there could be if we lose our collective focus on bring in new Lions and/or we don't report our MMRs each month. If we don't do what we need to do, or we don't report what we have done, then how can we achieve this goal. It is beyond understanding why we all would not do what we have to do to get new people who will help us sustain the good works we do in

our communities. The only result of doing so is that getting more people will allow us to provide more service more often. As an afterthought, getting more people will allow us to properly budget in the District as well as in individual clubs. If we don't get more people and/or don't report those that we do, then that process is also affected.

In my visits to Clubs I have been providing substantive information concerning getting more people and getting younger. At the Winter District meeting, which is open to all 1539 Lions in the District, on February 8 in Richmond, we will be conducting a meeting long workshop on this very subject. It will be an interactive worthwhile experience involving among other things everyone in attendance. We know that Richmond is some distance for some clubs, but carpool with your people as you'll go home with information that can help you grow your clubs. We will not waste your time. Your District Executive Committee is working hard on this so your time won't be wasted, and your experience will be positive.

We fully believe that we can reach 1600. By working together as Lions, we can increase our numbers and have more of an impact on a greater number of people. It only takes one Lion to step up and believe something can be done. When that happens, we all know it will be done.

The Second VDG

PCC Reed Fish

This month the duties and responsibilities of the Second Vice District Governor (VDG) will be reviewed.

Districts elect a second vdg in accordance with International Constitutional By-Laws and the district's constitution which states that the candidate must have been president of a club, served at least two years on the board and have been either a zone chair, district secretary or treasurer. They also must be an active member in good standing and have received the endorsement of their club or the majority of clubs in the District.

The second vdg assists the governor with membership retention and increasing the awareness among Lions about the association's various programs. The specific responsibilities of this officer are to:

- Further the purposes of this association;
- Perform such administrative duties assigned by the district governor;
- Perform such other functions and acts required by the International Board of Directors;
- Participate in the cabinet meetings, and conduct meetings in the absence of the district governor, and the first vdg and participate in council meetings as appropriate;
- Familiarize himself/herself with the health and status of the clubs in the district, review the monthly financial report and assist the district governor and the first vdg in identifying and strengthening the existing and potential weak clubs;
- Conduct club visitation, as the representative of the district governor, when requested by the district governor;
- Assist the district governor and first vdg in planning and conducting the annual district convention;
- Serve as the District Governor Team liaison between the District Global Leadership Team, working as an active member of the District Global Leadership Team along with the District Governor, First Vice District Governor and other Global Leadership Team members to establish and implement a district-wide leadership development plan;
- Work with the District Governor, First Vice District Governor, and the Global Membership Team to develop and implement a district-wide plan for membership growth;

- Work with the District LCIF Coordinator and assist the committee to achieve the goals of the year through regular distribution of LCIF information and materials to increase understanding and support of LCIF;
- Work with the District Information Technology Committee and assist the committee to promote the use of the association's website and the Internet among the clubs and members to obtain information, file reports, purchase club supplies, etc.;
- At the request of the district governor, supervise other district committees;
- Assist the district governor, first vdg and the cabinet in planning of the next year, including the district budget;
- Familiarize himself/herself with the duties of the district governor so that, in the event of a vacancy in the offices of district governor and first vdg he/she would be better prepared to assume the duties and responsibilities of said offices as the acting district governor or acting vdg until the vacancies are filled according to these by-laws and rules of procedure adopted by the International Board of Directors.

If a vacancy occurs in the offices of district governor and first vice district governor, the second vice district governor serves as acting district governor until the vacancy is filled by the International Board of Directors for the remainder of the term. If a vacancy occurs in the office of first vice district governor, the second vice district governor serves as acting first vice district governor until the vacancy is filled in accordance with the district (single, sub- or multiple) constitution and by-laws.

Because the second vice district governor directly participates in the administration of the district as part of the district governor team, this helps prepare them to become the first vdg when the new Lion's year begins.

The 2nd vdg position is a very important office as it allows the person to be very active in the planning of the District. The duties appear to be quite a lot, but when broken down many of them are the same a club officer does for a single club but in this case it is for many clubs.






